

**TIPS FOR USE OF YOUR ENVELOPES – With Thanks!**

1. Please write the amount of your donation on the envelope.
2. Please do not use scotch tape. It makes the envelopes harder to open and it tends to make them stick to other envelopes.
3. Please do not fold your cash if at all possible. The new ‘plastic’ money does not flatten and again, make for difficult handling and processing.
